
UNITED TO THRIVE

EQUITY

is at the center of a thriving community.

Equity means giving everyone the resources and opportunities they need to succeed based on their unique needs and goals.

ESSENTIAL NEEDS

Only 23 affordable rentals are available for every 100 needed by low-income central lowans.

ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY

36% of central lowans do not have cash on hand to cover a \$400 emergency expense.

EARLY CHILDHOOD SUCCESS

46% of children from low-income households are not ready for kindergarten

EDUCATION SUCCESS

24% of central lowa students are chronically absent from school - an increase of 14,000 students from pre-pandemic levels.

HEALTH & WELL-BEING

Nearly 1 in 5 central lowa adults report that their overall health is "fair" or "poor." This is the highest it has been in over a decade.

Who is ALICE?

ALICE isn't an individual person; ALICE is an acronym. It stands for **A**sset **L**imited, **I**ncome **C**onstrained, **E**mployed. It describes households that earn more than the federal poverty level but can't afford the basics where they live. These struggling households are forced to make impossible choices every day. ALICE workers are the engine that keeps our economy running – including our childcare providers, bank tellers, warehouse stockers, retail clerks, health care workers, and others. ALICE might be a family member, a friend, a neighbor – or you.

INCREASING FOOD SECURITY

1 in 10 central lowans are food insecure.

CREATING YOUTH OPPORTUNITIES

In central lowa, **6.1%** of youth ages **16-19** are disengaged from school or work.





ADDRESSING CHILDCARE CAPACITY

In central lowa there are only **1 licensed** childcare slots for every **3 children**

AFFORDABLE HOUSING AND HOMELESSNESS

More than 43% of central lowa renters are rent-burdened, spending more than 30% of their income on housing.
