United Way of Central Iowa is seeking a Research and Data Associate to advance United Way's mission of improving lives by researching, identifying, gathering, and coordinating relevant community data for the organization's advocacy and strategic use. The technical work and community collaborations established and maintained by this position help meet the need and identify measures in the Community Impact United to Thrive focus areas of Essential Needs, Early Childhood Success, Education Success, Economic Opportunity and Health



& Well-Being This position helps advance UWCI's mission and intentional focus on equity to integrate an equity perspective and framework that center on diversity and inclusion.

In addition to having the appropriate knowledge and experience to successfully perform the accountabilities of the role, the best qualified candidate will be a strong team player with experience in taking complex data and creating user-friendly visuals and written content to tell the story of an organization's work and strategy. A passion for UWCl's mission is a must.

We are committed to building an inclusive team; we invite candidates of all backgrounds to apply. This position offers a full benefits package, a hybrid remote work schedule, (2 days at home, 3 days in the office after 90 days) and a starting salary range from \$61,000 – 65,000 depending on skills and experience.

Essential Accountabilities Include (but not limited to):

- Identify, gather, and organize complex data sets from relevant sources (e.g. American Community Survey, ALICE reports, state/local government, school districts, other organizations, UWCI surveys, needs assessments, various internal data, etc.).
- Simplify complex data into user-friendly displays, reports, and digital content by creating understandable stories, charts, and insights/takeaways including drafting visuals and written content that tell the story of our work.
- Work with design, content, digital strategy, events, and resource development teams to further refine data visuals and content into audience-appropriate graphics and text.
- Collaborate with all Community Impact Officers, the Senior Community Impact Services Officer, and other
 organizational colleagues to find the necessary data and measures and strategize to further advocate and
 support United to Thrive strategies and community mobilization efforts.
- Ensure data collected is properly checked and vetted by fellow Research & Data team members or the Senior Community Impact Services Officer.
- Delivers presentations to key audiences and groups based on complex research and results to support the understanding and strategic use of data.
- Project manage and track multiple data assignments and requests in the team's project management tool.
- Provide operational support in the documentation of data Standard Operating Procedures (SOPS), and project organization in MS Teams to support the historical documentation of data projects for future records.
- Stay abreast of key community issues, evidence-based best practices, and research to inform and shape current and future investments, initiatives, and programs that support outcomes for individuals and households throughout central lowa.
